We are proud that St Laurence's is registered as an official 'Place of Welcome'

Places of Welcome is a national scheme of recognised programmes run by local community groups who want everyone in their neighbourhood to have a place to go for a friendly face, a hot drink and a conversation if and when they need it.

With over 450 across the UK, each Place of Welcome is unique, but all provide a place for people to connect with one another, find belonging and offer gifts and skills that interest them. Places of Welcome take place in a variety of different venues, including churches, community centres, mosques, temples and other community group buildings across the UK.

Services

We hold two all-age Eucharists each weekend (one with worship band, the other with recorded music). These are both new services that have been introduced since the pandemic. On a Saturday evening we see around 70 people sharing in the Eucharist and Sunday morning in excess of 50. This means that when we get to the 11.00 traditional Sung Eucharist we have already welcomed some 120 souls to church.

We hold Messy Church (Messy Mass) at times during the year linked to Church Festivals. This was launched by Bishop Philip with Messy Epiphany in 2018 and in 2022 we introduced our Saturday Club.

We recently set up a small working group made up of our (Primary) Church School staff and church members to plan worship, that both takes place in church and which the clergy lead in school. This has led to a more consistent approach and has helped children to make connections between the worship at school and worship at home. We are making plans to run (in partnership with St. Michael's School) a young people's Christian discovery course for 2023.


